## Founder Chairman's Message

Dear Friends,

During the year 2022-23, we managed to remain afloat and moved forward, nevertheless. Keeping in view our main objective of empowering of adolescents and their parents/teachers, we launched 'Pathways' programme-visiting the schools, talking to the students and inviting them to the National centre for a variety of group discussions and interactions. Response has been good. We appreciate the resolve of some of the schools seeking our expertise to promote values and inculcate civic behavior in their young students. In the process, somehow we get an impression that parental care is inadequate or misconstrued. Some of the counseling cases which come for help and guidance, were found to be 'hardened', and an earlier intervention would have resolved the conflicts better!

We partnered with the Indian Association of Life Skill Education (IALSE) in organising the 9<sup>th</sup> International Life Skill Conference, from 04-06<sup>th</sup> November 2022, in the Rajdhani College, New Delhi. The Conference Report was in fact prepared by the UVCT expert team, consisted of Prof. Gita Bamezai and Ms. Shashi Chhetri. It has been a fulfilling experience, which provided a platform to interact with UNFPA Country Representatives, Ms. Wojnar, and many experts in the field of life skills.

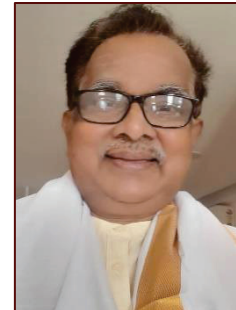
A shot in the arm of the UVCT was a recognition accorded on 1<sup>st</sup> October 2022, by the Mahatma Awards, an initiative of Shri Amit Sachdeva. I humbly submit that the 'Life Time Achievement Award 2022', was presented to me for work with 'Adolescents and Young Lives'. Though I don't look for awards, once it was accorded, I did feel that hard work will not go unnoticed. In this context, we may recall that UVCT played a pioneering role in obtaining a distinct status for 'Adolescents' in the Indian planning system and programmatic initiatives. UVCT'S 'Shakti' project (1995) that was meant to harness enormous energies of school drop-outs and under achievers was accepted by the UN as the BASIS for their Life Skills Modules of 2001. The Trust established the first ever National Centre for Adolescents in New Delhi, which focuses on a wide range of adolescent centric issues and advocacy programmes.

The Target Intervention (TI) programme for prevention of HIV/AIDS, in Wazirpur Industrial Area of North Delhi, won the second position among various TIs of Delhi. In appreciation, their team leader, Mr. Dinesh Kumar, was adjudged as the UVCT's "Best Employee of the year 2022-23.o. The UVCT-Childline project at Kalyan Railway Station and UNICEF-Childline project at

Thane Rural were carried on creditably; though the whole scheme of Childline (from all over India) was wound up by the GOI (end of Aug 2023).

Funding continued to be our main problem. Perhaps, same is the situation for all like-minded NGOs. It is the resolve of the Members and the staff that helped us get-going, with a hope that the situation shall improve sooner or later. I thank everyone who helped us in the ways possible.

**Urivi Vikram Charitable Trust (UVCT)** is a national level non-governmental organization, with a focus on social and economic empowerment of adolescents (aged 10 to 19 years) and young adult. The Trust has played a pioneering role in obtaining a distinct status for ‘Adolescents’ in the, Indian planning system and programmatic initiatives. Established as the first ever National Centre for Adolescent in New Delhi, it focuses on a wide range of adolescent centric issues including Life Skill Education. UVCT has also played a distinct role in empowering girls from the marginalized sections of the society through education, provision of health facilities and vocational training. Among many other development programmes, UVCT has undertaken projects for women empowerment and awareness campaigns on public health, environmental protection and reformation/rehabilitation of delinquents.

**VISION:** UVCT’s vision is to find innovative ways to transform the ever-growing population of India or the “Burden of Population” into an “Asset of Human Resource” and thereby help in ensuring better utilization of India’s demographic dividend.

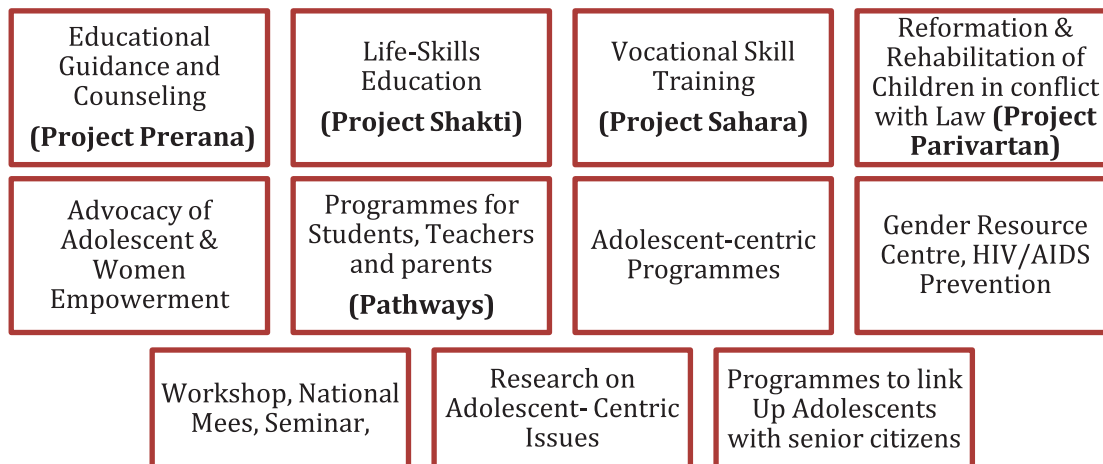


**MISSION:** UVCT has been striving to work for the development of adolescents and young adults of the nation through “empowerment” rather than “control”, it brings back the dropouts, underachievers, and children in conflict with law, especially those belonging to marginalized and deprived sections of the society, into the mainstream. It is our mission to help these children to become socially responsible and economically productive citizens of the world.

### OBJECTIVES

- ❖ **Promote Awareness about Adolescent Issues:** Develop awareness through seminars, group discussions, camps enable young adults to find solutions to their problems- psychological, financial, ethical and social. **Development of a Realistic Value System Among Adolescents:** Help adolescents acquire a realistic value system that is conducive to the development of a healthy society. The concept of oneness of all religions and love for the homeland is acquired by youth by building their level of consciousness.
- ❖ **Develop Educational & Skill Training:** Develop educational and skill training programs for school dropouts and underachievers to enable them to become not only economically productive but also socially responsible citizens of India and the world.
- ❖ **Develop Vocational Skills Among the Young Adults:** Develop skills among the young adults and women with regard to textiles, handicrafts and other ancillary industries.
- ❖ **Promote Equality of Status:** Endeavor to promote equality of status and opportunity, assuring dignity of the individual, and the unity, integrity of the Nation, services for the hygiene, health and happiness for all the citizens of India.
- ❖ **Provide Financial Literacy for Youth & Women:** Provide Financial Literacy and microfinance facilities to youth and women of economically weaker sections for employment and banking services.

## THRUST AREAS OF UVCT



- ❖ **Counselling and Career Guidance Programme (Project PRERANA, since 1994):** The Trust focuses on adolescents in school to sustain their interest in education through Counselling and Career guidance. The Trust conducted workshop on “Student Counselling: The Need of the Day” and visited schools, especially government-run, to make the adolescent students aware of coping mechanisms and the varied career avenues. As a corollary to the outreach efforts, more than 50 Career Melas were held in Delhi and in different parts of the country. A number of workshops/ seminars were held to encourage and improve healthy interpersonal relations amongst Adolescents-Parents-Teachers.
- ❖ **Personality Development for drop-outs and push-out children (Project SHAKTI, since 1995):** In India, a large number of children who are drop-outs or are pushed-out of the school education system, require assistance and should become part of the mainstream education. For that purpose, an innovative programme “Shakti: The Personality Development” was launched in 1995. Batches of 30 to 40 drop-outs and under-achievers, were given a month’s orientation to build on their existing strengths and tone-down their weak-points. By 2022, about 100 batches of students of Shakti programme were given an orientation with remarkable results. UNFPA and UN IAWG P&D acknowledged UVCT’S Shakti Programme as a **basis** for their “Life Skills for promotion of Health for Out of School Adolescents” programme (July, 2003).
- ❖ **Empowering young adults through various vocational and professional courses (Project SAHARA, since 1995):** To make the young people economically productive, the Trust provides training in various vocational and professional courses. UVCT was invited for accreditation from the National Institute Open Schooling for its course in Beauty Culture, Stitching & Embroidery, Typing and Word Processing.

- ❖ **Reform and Rehabilitate Young Offenders in Tihar Prisons (Project PARIVARTAN, since 2007):** Another salient effort has been bringing the delinquent children and young offenders into the mainstream through ‘Life Skills Education’ and skill up-gradation programme. UVCT has been involved in augmenting the efforts of the juvenile justice system based on the LSE programme by transforming their personality and training them in various skills.

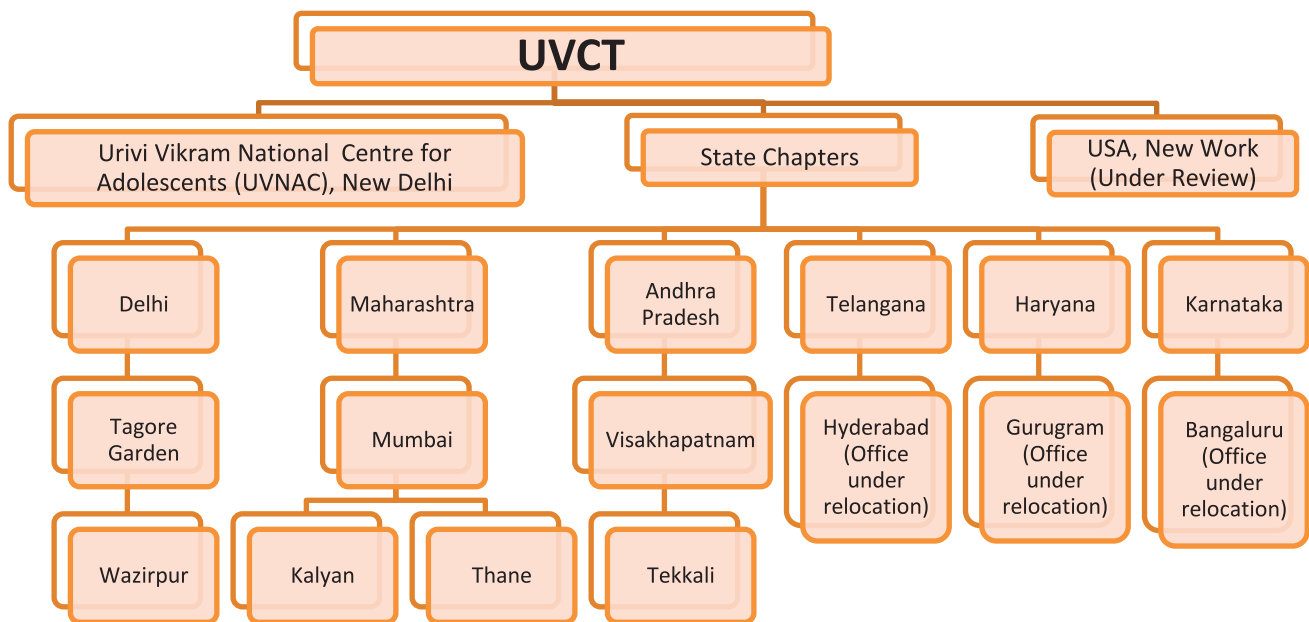


- ❖ **Financial Assistance to Students (Project UMMEED):** Launched in October 2007, the project provides financial assistance in the form of school/college fees, books, stationeries and other required support to those students who are academically brilliant but economically poor.
- ❖ **Programme for Teachers and Students in Schools (PATHWAYS PROGRAMME, 2022):** The programme has been re-launched in schools after COVID19 pandemic. Workshops for students, teachers and parents have been organised on different topics related to them. UVCT’s panel of renowned counsellors is involved in the programmes.

### ORGANISATIONAL STRENGTHS

- ❖ Approved by the Ministry of Finance, GOI, u/s 80 G of income Tax Act, for availing tax exemption on contribution received by the Trust and authorized to receive foreign contribution vide FCRA Regn. No.231650755 (under review).
- ❖ Registered in the NITI Ayog’s Darpan Portal with the unique ID: DL/2009/0017783
- ❖ In 2017, accredited and empanelled by the National CSR Hub at the Tata Institute of Social Sciences (TISS), Mumbai along with eight others, in their Proposal Bank of Social Sector Projects., UVCT developed a model of the Yuva Shakti Centres (YSC’s) for different locations in India.

### ORGANISATIONAL PROFILE:



### NOTABLE ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF UVCT: Obtained A Distinct Status for Adolescent Segment

- ❖ UVCT organized a three days National Meet (July 1999), with the cooperation of the Ministry of Youth Affairs, GOI, and a few other like-minded NGOs/organisations, on the theme, “**Towards a Policy for Young Adults**”. Dr. Rao’s article in Yojana, a Planning Commission Publication, and titled ‘Adolescents say that they are no more Children’ stirred the consciousness of the planners.
- ❖ In 2005, when Dr Abdul Kalam and other prominent leaders talked of making India a Super Power by 2020, UVCT organized yet another **Three-days National Meet on ‘Adolescents: Vision 2020’**.
- ❖ National Seminar on “**Demographic Dividend: Challenges of Young People in India**”, organized in 2015 to strengthen the processes of involvement of young people for the national development.



- ❖ Second National Seminar on, “**Mainstreaming Skills in Education**” was organized in 2017 in collaboration with stakeholders from Skill Development and Education sectors.
- ❖ **Establishing the First-Ever National Centre for Adolescents:** UVCT established the first ever ‘National Centre for Adolescents’, in September 2007 in Dwarka, New Delhi. The Centre had a distinguished visitor, Hon’ble Dr APJ Abdul Kalam, Former President of India on 09 Oct 2008 when he held an interactive session with adolescents. The other notable visitors have been Sh. Shiv Raj Patil, Governor of Punjab and Dr Karan Singh, a Statesman and an eminent educationist.

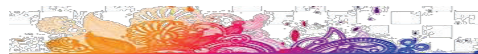
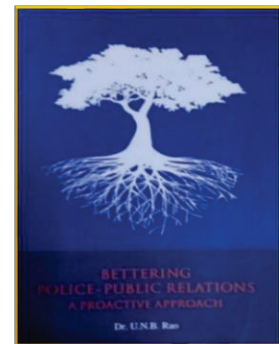
### **ACTIVITIES IN PROJECT MODE (During the last ten years)**

- ❖ **Vocational training** in various marketable skills, with linkages to livelihood has helped young adults, especially belonging to the marginalized sections of the society. Projects were undertaken in Delhi, Maharashtra and Andhra Pradesh with the support of Govt. of India; UNFPA; PSUs and Banks; National Regional Banks and Financial Institutions
- ❖ **Target Intervention Centres (HIV/AIDS)** for migrant workers in the industrial area of Wazirpur (continuing since 2011) under DSACS, GNCT of Delhi;
- ❖ **Child Line services** have been in operation at the Kalyan Railway Station (Maharashtra) in collaboration with the Childline India Foundation since December 2016. Which is helping in rescuing distressed children and educating people about child rights and protection;
- ❖ The excellent performance of UVCT’ team at Kalyan Centre brought another **short-term project by UNICEF MH Childline** and a sub-centre was established at Thane Rural in 2022-23.
- ❖ UVCT’s work in **reformation of juvenile delinquents** won appreciations, leading to a 3-year engagement in Reformation and Rehabilitation of Young Offenders, Jail No.5, Tihar Prisons (2017-20), partly funded by Bharat Petroleum Corporation Ltd (BPCL);
- ❖ **Project Saksham:** Under CSR initiatives of Mahanagar Gas Limited (MGL), during 2017- 2020, a comprehensive educational empowerment of more than 30,000 under-privileged students in Maharashtra, from 10 Government and aided Schools in Kalyan area of Thane district and about 60 schools of North-east Mumbai area (Chembur, Deonar, Ghatkopar, Ashok Nagar, etc), through various outreach programmes, remedial education, counselling, career guidance, financial support for infrastructure of schools and deserving students; orientation to relevant Principals / teachers / Parents, (Project Saksham in two phases);
- ❖ **Sohan Lal Commodity Management Private Limited (SLCM)** has been a benevolent collaborator to UVCT in running its vocational skills upgradation programmes. The programs went off well, benefitting more than 20,000 young adults, young women mostly;
- ❖ **STEP programme** for Women Empowerment in Bindapur, Delhi, under the Ministry of Women and Child, Govt of India (2016-17);
- ❖ **IDBI Capital supported Comprehensive Skill Development Programme** to prepare candidates for employment with banks and non-banking financial companies in Delhi. It helped young people to reach to an economical independency by being employed, through placement. Out of 500 beneficiaries nearly 60 percent of them have also been linked with livelihood opportunities;
- ❖ IDBI Bank supported **livelihood programme for underprivileged Women and Youth** in Thane, Maharashtra. The project made difference in the lives of more than 2300 individuals in the locality. **Psycho-Social Intervention, Parents Teachers Meets, School outreach programmes** were the main components of the programme. A specialized programme ‘**SAIME**’ (Soft Skills, Awareness, IT, Management & Entrepreneurship Development) was also conducted to train Graduates and UG students with computer, Spoken English, Marketing Skills and Life Skills. A 150-hour long course developed with the support of K.V. Pendharkar College, Dombivli.

- ❖ **Happy Project** in northern districts of Mumbai funded by Tata Trusts (DESH), during 2016-19;
- ❖ Empowerment of Government school children in rural areas of Delhi and Haryana with the support of National Children Fund and Jindal Foundation grants;
- ❖ Establishment of **two Adolescent Centres**—One in collaboration with BHEL, Hyderabad (2014-15) and with Visakha Port Trust (under process);
- ❖ Projects in Delhi to bring the delinquent children into the mainstream through **'Life Skills Education'** education and skill up gradation, with the support of the Delhi High Court (2015);
- ❖ Adolescent Development Programmes under NPYAD Scheme of the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Govt. of India (since 1994 and continuing);
- ❖ **Gender Resource Centre** at Kapashera as part of the Delhi Government Initiative (2012 -2015);
- ❖ UVCT ran the **IGNOU Study Centre** for 10 years (2000-2020) in Psychology and Social Work at Graduate and Post-Graduate level and made a difference in the lives of more than 10,000 students.

### **ABOUT THE FOUNDER & CHAIRMAN: DR U N B RAO, IPS (RETD)**

Dr. UNB Rao is a distinguished IPS Officer who obtained his doctorate from the **IIT (Delhi) on the subject of 'Student Psychology'**. He performed his police service commendably, with utmost integrity, winning public trust and appreciation. He received the **'Police Medal for Meritorious Services'** and **ultimately, the most prestigious 'President's Police Medal for Distinguished Services'**. IIT Delhi Alumni Association honoured Dr. Rao for his **'Outstanding Contribution to the National Development'**. He was also conferred with the prestigious **"Mahatma Award for Lifetime Achievement, 2022"**, in appreciation of his impactful work with 'Adolescents and Young lives'. He co-authored the book, **'Adolescent concerns through their own Eyes'**. Recently his book on **'Bettering Police-Pubic Relations: A Proactive Approach has been published'**.



### **THE VALUE OF CONCENTRATION... (Swami Vivekananda)**

Once during his visit to Chicago, USA, Swami Vivekananda was taking a stroll on the banks of a river. There he saw some young boys with an air gun trying to shoot at eggshells floating in the river. As the shells rolled up and down on the choppy water, the boys could not hit them. None of the boys hit an eggshell, despite trying many times. Swami Vivekananda was watching their game with keen interest. Seeing this, the boys called out to him, "Sir, you have been watching us all this time. Would you like to give it a try?" Swami Vivekananda smiled and said that he would like to try. Taking the air gun in his hand, he aimed at the eggshells and concentrated on the target for some time. Then he fired the gun twelve times and hit an eggshell each time!

The boys were awestruck on seeing Swamiji's skill and asked, "Well, Sir, how could you do this? Have you had a lot of shooting practice?" Swamiji laughed and said, "No, I have never practiced shooting." The boys were confused, "Then how is it that you shot so well?" Swami Vivekananda replied, "Well, let me tell you a secret. Whatever you do, concentrate all your attention on it. Think of nothing else. If you are shooting, keep your mind only on the target. Your aim will not fail. Concentration can work wonders. Even when you are studying, think only of the lesson at hand. Then you will easily remember what you study."



## URIVI VIKRAM NATIONAL CENTRE FOR ADOLESCENT (UVNAC) *National Headquarters of UVCT*

### ESTABLISHMENT

UVCT recognized that ADOLESCENTS (aged 10 to 19 years, as categorized by WHO) required a distinct status in the Indian planning and firmly advocated the same. UVCT established the first ever '**National Centre for Adolescents UVNAC**', in September 2007 in Dwarka, New Delhi.

UVNAC deals with important tasks such as planning, communication of projects and provides all kind of support to state teams. All projects and programmes conducted by UVCT and its state chapters are supervised and monitored by UVNAC. We conduct following programmes as an effort to focus on issues which affect lives of adolescents in the country:

- ❖ Organising workshops/ Seminars / Webinars
- ❖ Counselling and consultancy by experienced counsellors
- ❖ Career Guidance with the help of different scientific assessment tests
- ❖ Research and In-depth Studies
- ❖ Outreach Programmes for students in Delhi and NCR like Career Mela
- ❖ Organising Hum Kishore Festival for all schools from Dwarka and nearby areas
- ❖ Skill Development Centre to provide various vocational training courses

### MAJOR ACTIVITIES DURING THE YEAR

#### **New Initiative:**

- 1) **Pathway Programme in Schools:** The Pathway programme was launched in November 2022 for students, their parents and teachers in schools. The programme includes organising workshops in school on various topics relevant to students and teachers. During the year workshops for the students of class 6<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> in Modern Convent School, Basava International School, Shiksha Bharati Global School and Shokeen International School were organised with the support of a number of eminent speakers. Some of the topics addressed in the workshops were: 'Emerging careers; Career counselling; Nurturing values for teens; Need for discipline in an individual's life; Building healthy interpersonal relationships and right values; Coping with adolescence, etc.

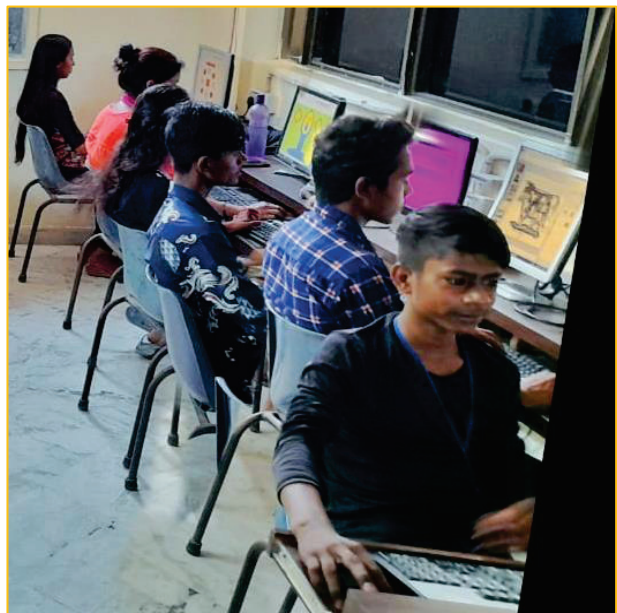




**Special Lecture by Dr. Rao:** Making another addition to the series of workshops being conducted in the schools, Dr. UNB Rao addressed the teachers of Shiksha Bharati Global School on 'How to deal with adolescents?' The session emphasized the role of teachers in bringing their adolescent students up in a healthy manner.



**Setting-up Skill Development Centre at UVNAC:** UVNAC in Sector - 22 of Dwarka, is surrounded by Pochanpur, Dhoolsiras, Barthal and Bagdola village. It has a mixed population of different castes including poor people from general caste and minority communities who live with limited amenities. Skill Development Centre at UVNAC. The centre gives priority to a student who could not complete his school education. Life skills education is also imparted here for adolescents. The centre is to fill the gap between the market demands and availability of services in terms of skills and services in high demand. Good quality advance courses will empower young people economically, and help in the process of mainstreaming the socially vulnerable sections and rehabilitate them in general.



## Other Activities:

**Co-organised International Conference on Life Skills Education (ICLSE):** Co-organised an International Conference on Life Skills Education (ICLSE 2022) on 'Sustainable Future in the Post Pandemic Era: Life Skills as Strategic Enablers' with Indian Association of Life Skills Education (IALSE), Rajdhani College, Univ. of Delhi, and International Hindu University, Florida, in collaboration with UNFPA, sponsored by ICSSR on 4-6 November 2022 at New Delhi. The conference focused on the connection between life skills as the key drivers for capacity building for a proactive and positive recovery in the post pandemic era, towards ensuring a green future. Scope for policy recommendations and providing a platform for practitioners to come together were some of the highlights of the conference.

**Felicitation of the TI Team:** A meeting was organised at UVNAC on 25<sup>th</sup> July under the chairmanship of Dr. UNB Rao. Prof. Gita Bamezai, Mr. Ashwani Khanna, and members from the headquarter, Skill Development Centre, Tagore Garden, Delhi and the HIV/ AIDS Target Intervention project team, Wazirpur in Delhi gathered under one roof. Mr. Sanjay (Trainer Computer) represented his team on behalf of Mr. Sehgal (Supervisor SDC, TG). Ms. Shivani Soni, Project In-charge,



TI Project explained the work of Targeted Intervention team of HIV/AIDS programme. The aim of TI Project (funded by DSACS, Govt. of NCT) is to reduce the rate of transmission of HIV AIDS among the most vulnerable and marginalized population, such as young migrant workers.

## SKILL DEVELOPMENT CENTRE TAGORE GARDEN EXTN, NEW DELHI

The centre located in the MCD Complex at Tagore Garden Extension is located in the South-west of Delhi adjoining the neighboring areas of Raghbir Nagar, Shyam Nagar, Janta Colony and Titarpur in New Delhi. The slum population essentially comprises migrants in search of jobs from different states like UP, Bihar, West Bengal, Rajasthan, Madhya Pradesh and Haryana. Around 59 percent of the population is illiterate. The low economic status, living and working style of the community has left the community less capable of attending to the requirements of children. Children loiter throughout the day and are unable to adapt to the school environment. They require service which would look after their needs and also provide a stimulating environment in which they can be taken care of and help them to learn some basic lessons.

The Skill Development Centre provides training to young people and women in the various vocational courses like **Computer Application, Tally, Dress Designing, Cutting & Tailoring, Beauty Culture, English Shorthand and Typing, Spoken English, etc.** Many short-term courses/workshops like financial literacy, crafting, soap making, candle making, jute work, etc. have also been organised by the experts.



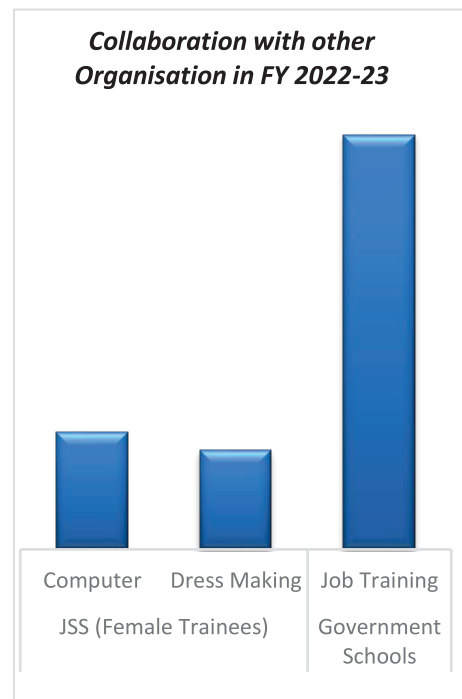
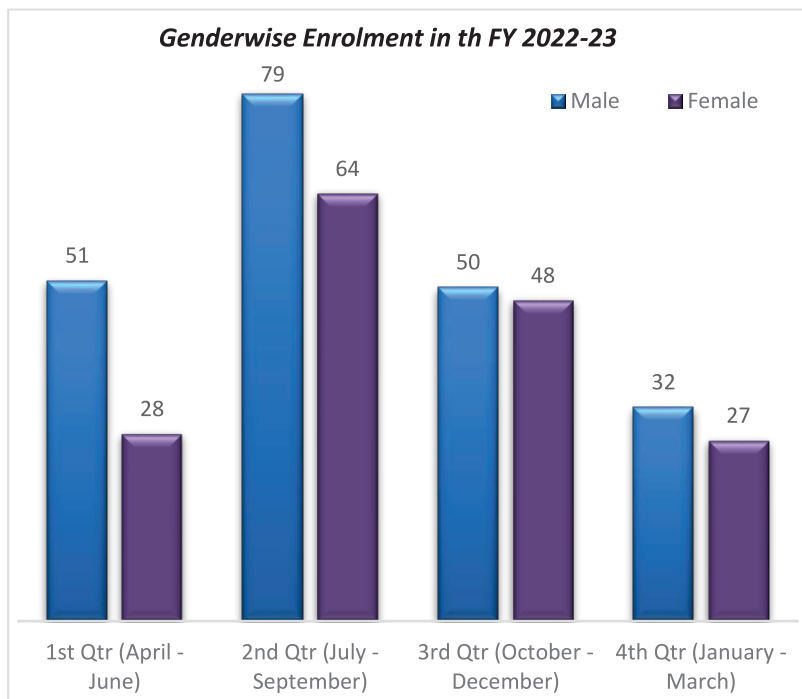
### MAJOR ACTIVITIES OF THE YEAR

**Certificate Distribution Programme:** Certificate Distribution program was organized at UVCT's Skill Development Centre located at Tagore Garden on 16.4.2022. Dr. UNB Rao, Chairman, UVCT, Prof. Gita Bamzai, UVCT, Mr. Bakshi, Vice President, D-Block, Tagore Garden were the Chief Guests during the programme. Apart from the students from current and previous batches, many dignitaries of the locality contributed in making the program a success by attending the function. Ms. Pinki Vij, Head, Kirtan Mandali and Ms. Snehlata Kohli, School Management Committee Member were some of them. Students presented dance and song programs and shared their experiences related to their courses at UVCT.

**Job Training Programme for Students of Government Schools:** Students of vocational courses from government schools from nearby areas came for training in computer, tally, stenography, typing, dress designing and beauty culture courses. These students are provided practical training to work in the fields so that they can be fully prepared to earn a living as soon as they complete their school education. Along with job training, these students are also given classes in some other areas like financial literacy, health and cleanliness, career guidance at the centre.

**Multipurpose Camp:** Delhi State Legal Services Authority (DSLISA) organised a multipurpose camp at the Centre on 23<sup>rd</sup> July, 2022. The objectives of the camp were to update the Aadhar Card/ Voter ID card and provide free COVID vaccination to community members from the neighbourhood. About 150 people from the surrounding areas of Raghbir Nagar and Tagore Garden availed the free service provided during the camp. Doctors from the MCD Clinics came to the centre for the vaccination programme. The legal advisor and students from DSLISA addressed the people on the spot and also provided them free counselling on legal matters.



**Importance of Menstrual Hygiene:** A one-day free orientation session on Importance of Menstrual Hygiene for the female students of Job training at UVCT's Skill Development Centre, Tagore Garden, in collaboration with the Go Girl Foundation on 02<sup>nd</sup> June 2022.

**Career Guidance Sessions:** The most vulnerable stage in terms of career is high school. Uncertainty and lack of clarity force most students toward making wrong career choices. An orientation workshop on 'Importance Steps towards Right Career Selection' was conducted for trainees on 18.06.2022 by Ms. Nikita. The primary objective of the session was to make the students understand that planning the career is the first and the most important step towards a right career selection. Another session on Career Guidance was conducted by Mr. Pradeep Chaudhary, who advocates for the cause of 'employability among youth' by providing career guidance in government schools. The workshop was interspersed with wide sub themes such as the broad divisions within a company, attributes of a great employee, motivation, communication, search of an interest area, preparatory measures for any govt. competitive exams and growth of industries such as travel and tourism, hotels etc. in the post pandemic era. Mr. Chaudhary guided the participants on their career plans for the future.



**Session on Financial Literacy:** Financial Literacy is the ability to understand skills to manage financial resources effectively for the financial well-being. The skills include personal financial management, budgeting, and investing. Studies indicate that financial literacy educational interventions in high school appear to have a positive impact on knowledge and measurable financial behaviours. Recognising its importance, UVCT conducted one-day free orientation session on Financial Literacy for the students from various Government Schools, who come for job-training to UVCT's Skill Development Centre at Tagore Garden. The session was delivered on 04<sup>th</sup> June 2022 by Mr. VK Kaul, DD (Admin), UVCT. Mr. Kaul has served as Chief Manager, State Bank of India for many years.



**Life Skill Training:** The centre has always been in favour of the fact that Life skills not only make life easier but also give an opportunity to know about ourselves. Vocational/ Technical Skills are said to be incomplete without imparting LSE. UVCT is pushing the envelope by infusing the two which narrows down the gap between skills in-demand at institutes and ones required for smooth navigation through life. Our students celebrated the 'hussle' and 'hassle' of regular lives through free life skills training.



**Collaboration with Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSS):** JSS under the M/o Skill Development and Entrepreneurship, GOI has the mandate to provide vocational skills in non-formal mode to non-literate, neo-literates, persons with in the age group of 15-45 years. The Trust collaborated with JSS to support the government initiative and conducted training programmes on Computers, Dress Designing and Beauty Culture.



**Collaboration with NIIT Foundation:** UVCT runs various NIIT verified courses in its centres. NIIT as collaborating partner conducts many activities.

- 1) This year, NIIT organised an expert session on Interview Skills for the vocational trainees on February 06<sup>th</sup> February 2023. M. Keith Egbert, Sr. Job Placement Coordinator from NIIT provided tips to appear in the interview.
- 2) NIIT Foundation also organised a PPT competition for all computer trainees. Mr. Rakesh, a trainee in the Advance Course in Computer secured 3<sup>rd</sup> position. The topic of the competition was 'Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav' and more than seventy students participated with full enthusiasm

## UVCT's TARGET INTERVENTION (TI) PROGRAMME WAZIRPUR INDUSTRIAL AREA, NEW DELHI

### In Collaboration with Delhi State aids Control society (DSACS)

HIV/AIDS is a leading health problem in the world majorly developing countries. In developing countries India is also facing from increasing PLHIV (people living with HIV positive) cases in very vast level. In this favour Indian government has made a plan to prevent HIV/Aids and started HIV/AIDS awareness, prevention and identification program with the help of Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs). UVCT has also been supporting the programme by collaborating with Delhi State Aids Control Society (DSACS) since 2011. UVCT works for the migrant population coming from other states for their livelihood. UVCT's team reaches out migrant people to make them aware about HIV/AIDS, STI, ICTC testing and TB etc. The awareness programmes include issues related to many health issues including *Safe Sex* which is the main source of HIV/AIDS. UVCT team conducts IPC session, congregation events, mid media events, demand generation activities amongst migrant population. UVCT team also organise CBS camp and health camp for getting high risk people ICTC tested and also linked the HIV infected people to ART centre.

## **A Few Experiences of Identifying and Linking HIV Positive Cases to ART**

- ❖ After an IPC session, a 36 years' old man living alone on rent in a slum area, contacted the ORW to get his HIV status checked. He informed that he is a daily wages worker and involved in high-risk behaviour (illegal sexual activities). The ORW got him checked in ICTC centre and he was found HIV positive. He was also infected with Tuberculosis. The ORW gave her full efforts and got him linked to DOTS centre first. Then he was linked to ART center in Baba Saheb Bhim Rao Ambedkar Hospital for HIV treatment. The ORW kept following him and checked his status him time to time. The Trust helped him financially as well. Now he is taking ART medicines regularly and is good in health.
- ❖ In Wazirpur industrial Area. A twenty-six year old illiterate male working in a Dhaba visited UVCT's CBS (Community Based Screening) camp. After testing he was detected HIV positive reactive. The team contacted the person and informed him about the test result. After knowing the result, he tried to avoid our team and stopped picking our phone calls. At last, we had to contact the Dhaba owner, he suggested us to contact the Pradhan of the area. Pradhan ji helped us to find him and we could trace him in another house. The person got tested at ICTC centre for confirmation and he was found HIV positive. After proper counselling, he agreed to link himself to ART center for treatment. Now, he is linked to ART center in Baba Saheb Bhim Rao Ambedkar Hospital and is taking medicine regularly.



## **MAHARASHTRA CHAPTER**

UVCT Maharashtra chapter has been working since 1999 with various programmes on empowerment of Women and Adolescents in Maharashtra. Team Maharashtra has been involved in various programmes, including Livelihood generation programs in Thane-Bhiwandi-Kalyan belt of Maharashtra since 1999. It regularly organises some program and others, including collaborative projects with UNFPA; Municipal Corporation of Thane, Ulhasnagar, Kalyan and Bhiwandi and Central Social Welfare Board. Of late, the Centre is working on remedial classes in govt-aided schools and vocational programs for women in need, besides conducting surveys to assess the needs of under-privileged school students.

### **UVCT's CHILDLINE CENTRE**

### **KALYAN RAILWAY STATION, MAHARASHTRA**

### **In Collaboration with Childline India Foundation (CIF)**

Childline, a 24 hours national helpline number working since 2018 for the children of the age group till 18 years. Any concerned person or child can call on 1098 helpline for the care and protection of a child. Childline works for the protection of the rights of all children, but special focus is on all children in need of care and protection, especially from the more vulnerable sections. Number of Children who were provided intervention by UVCT Childline team during the year 2022-23 was more than 250.

#### **Activities Undertaken by Childline are:**

- ❖ Awareness Campaign about Childline programme
- ❖ Training and Orientation programmes related to Children in the nearby areas
- ❖ Collaboration with other organisations
- ❖ Conduct personal and group outreach programmes on stations

The UVCT-Childline team consistently creating awareness among various groups of railway officials, staff, coolies, cleaners and the general public so that they could help the team in Child Protection. The

formation of Child Help Group was an important aspect that was taken up by UVCT Kalyan Railway Childline team. On an average 25 children were rescued in a month by the team during the FY 2022-23, out of which more than 95 percent were handed over to their families safely. Remaining children are sent to shelter homes for further necessary procedures.

## MAJOR ACTIVITIES DURING THE YEAR

**Celebration Of Elimination of Child Labour Week:** National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR) celebrated Elimination of Child Labour Week in the honour of World Day Against Child Labour in 75 places as part of the “75<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebrations of India’s independence – “Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav” in different districts from 12<sup>th</sup> to 20<sup>th</sup> June, 2022 to pay attention to the problem of child labour and to find ways to eradicate it. UVCT- Childline at Kalyan was selected by the NCPCR and various activities were organized:

**12<sup>th</sup> June 2022:** Campaign on platform No. 1 along with Railway police, home guards, Maharashtra security force, Railway security force and passengers. In which all these gives good response,

**13<sup>th</sup> June 2022:** Activities like slogan competition and drawing competition were organized at Navjeevan Centre Kalyan to aware children about Childline and the hazards of the child labour.

**14<sup>th</sup> June 2022:** Childline team along with the members of Navjeevan centre put stickers on auto-rickshaws and taxis, a very good response from the auto unions regarding the activity was received. Children also performed street plays near the auto union offices.



**15<sup>th</sup> June 2022:** A big Rally from CHD to commissioner bungalow was organized. The RPF also took part in the activity along with GRP, local police. Children wearing t-shirts printed with ‘anti-child labour’ were chanted slogans against child labour. Food and snacks were distributed to children at Navjeevan Centre.

**18<sup>th</sup> June 2022:** Awareness programmes were organised by the team on anti-child labour through street plays on station’s platforms, ticket house, bridges and railway premises

**20<sup>th</sup> June 2022:** The team created awareness at Kalyan station and surrounding areas through street plays

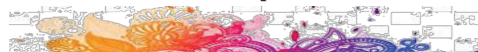

Mrs. Suvarna Mhaske and Mrs. Swati More attended the workshop on behalf of UVCT.



**Some Rescuing case studies:**

- 1) A thirteen years' child was spotted by non-guardian RPF on platform number 4/5 on 12<sup>th</sup> September 2022 at 10.00 pm. He handed over the child to Kalyan railway Childline. During the first intervention at desk, the child said that he worked in Jalna and selling milk. His owner did not pay him and also beat him, so he ran away and had come to visit his parent. The team contacted local corporator to investigate about his father, but the corporator informed that the child's father had left the job 3 days back and moved to his native place. The corporator assured that he will find and inform the father. After proper medical help the child was placed in shelter home and also presented before CWC. The child was handed over to parents by CWC on 01<sup>st</sup> December 2022.
- 2) A 14 years' child was spotted by non-guardian RPF on platform number 4/5 on 02 September at 2.27 pm. The child was brought to the desk and intervened. The child hid the truth and told the team that he had come to roaming on the station. Later it was found by the team that he had a habit of running away. The parents of the child were contacted, they also registered a mission FIR in MP. Parents were asked to come to station with documents, but it took them two days to reach Kalyan. The child was kept in shelter home after proper medical and COVID test. The child was presented before CWC on 05<sup>th</sup> September 2022 and was handed over to parents by CWC
- 3) A 3 years child was at Dombivali on 01<sup>st</sup> December 2022 at 5.35 pm by non-guardian RPF. The team found that the child strolled casually from his house and came to Kopar station. The child was unable to tell his address or contact, but the Childline staff with their unique ability to find things, were able to trace the child's mother who was also searching for the child. After proper document verification with the help of RPF the child was handed over to parents.





## UVCT's CHILDLINE SUB-CENTRE THANE RURAL, MAHARASHTRA

### In Collaboration with UNICEF MAHARASHTRA

UNICEF Maharashtra collaborated with UVCT team at Maharashtra for a new project for a period of February 2022 to December 2022 to run a Childline sub-centre at Thane Rural. The programme on "Strengthening CHILDLINE Services and Structures in Maharashtra", was in continuation with the UVCT-Childline centre at Kalyan Railway Station". Objective of the programme was to generate awareness, organizing outreach Programmes, open houses, counselling and case management. The team members visited lanes and shanties of Thane District to fulfil their target. The team members had a thorough field experience while handling cases, interacting with CWC members, DCPO, employees of shelter homes, social work agencies, other officials from the Legal, Medical, Police, Commissioner of Labour authorities etc. The team handled following cases:

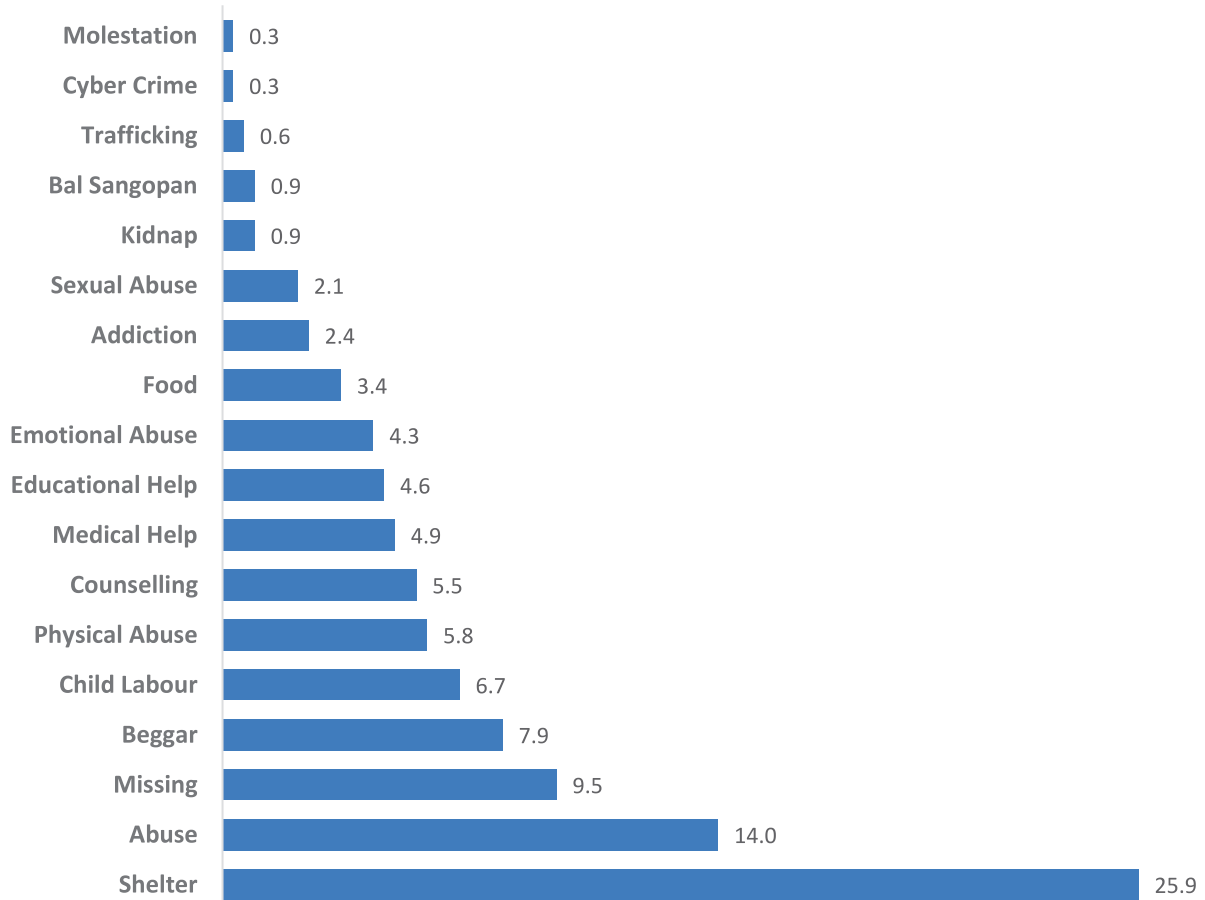

The Skill Development centre in the Municipal Community Complex at Visakhapatnam is engaged in many activities ranging from skill development, counselling, awareness programmes, especially for youth and women in the surrounding. The regular activities run by the centre are as following:

- ❖ Vocational Courses
- ❖ Life Skill Education
- ❖ Counselling- Individual, Group and Rural
- ❖ Career Guidance
- ❖ Programmes on Youth Employability
- ❖ Awareness Programme

Besides these regular activities, the centre at Visakhapatnam has been involved in conducting Parent Meets, Training of Trainers (TOR), Workshop for unemployed youth, Career Melas, Marital and Legal Aid counselling, remedial classes for weak students, to run various awareness programmes, etc.

### **MAJOR ACTIVITIES DURING THE YEAR**

**Regular programme of the Centre:** The centre was engaged in the regular programme on vocational training to the adolescent and young adults of the nearby areas. Mostly students attending the courses at UVCT are school drop-outs and want to learn skills to earn their livelihood. Mostly female trainees are enrolled in the courses like Tailoring, and Muggam



embroidery. Ms. Savithri, the trainer of these trainees has more than 30 years of experience in the industry and has been running the centre for many years, successfully.



**Collaboration with Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSS):** Centre collaborated with Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSS) to start courses at free of cost for the youth from economically weaker section. These courses were Electrical (for boys), Tailoring and Painting. These were three months' certificate programme conducted by the UVCT and JSS trainers in collaboration. A total of 120 students successfully completed the courses.



**Certificate Distribution Programme for JSS Programmes:** The certificate distribution programme for the course was organized on 07<sup>th</sup> February 2023 at the centre. Dr. UNB Rao, Founder Chairman, UVCT, Smt. Urivi Chaya, Vice Chairperson, UVCT, Sh. China Verraiyya Garu, Mr. Atul Rathi, UVCT (Andhra Chapter), Sh. Appala Naidu Garu, JSS Project Director, JSS team, Sh. NSP Rao Garu, SBI Chief, Sh. Nithin Kuranjan Garu and the team attended the program.



**Special class on Tailoring:** The centre always tries to invite industry experts to conduct special session with trainees. These sessions not only provide them with the subject knowledge but also guide them by with insights from the field. Ms. China Veeraiah Garu visited the tailoring classes and guide them in making their career in the field.

**Orientation Programme on Cartoon making:** An Orientation programme for Adolescents in cartoon-making was organised at the centre on 30th May 2022.

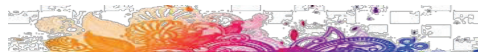

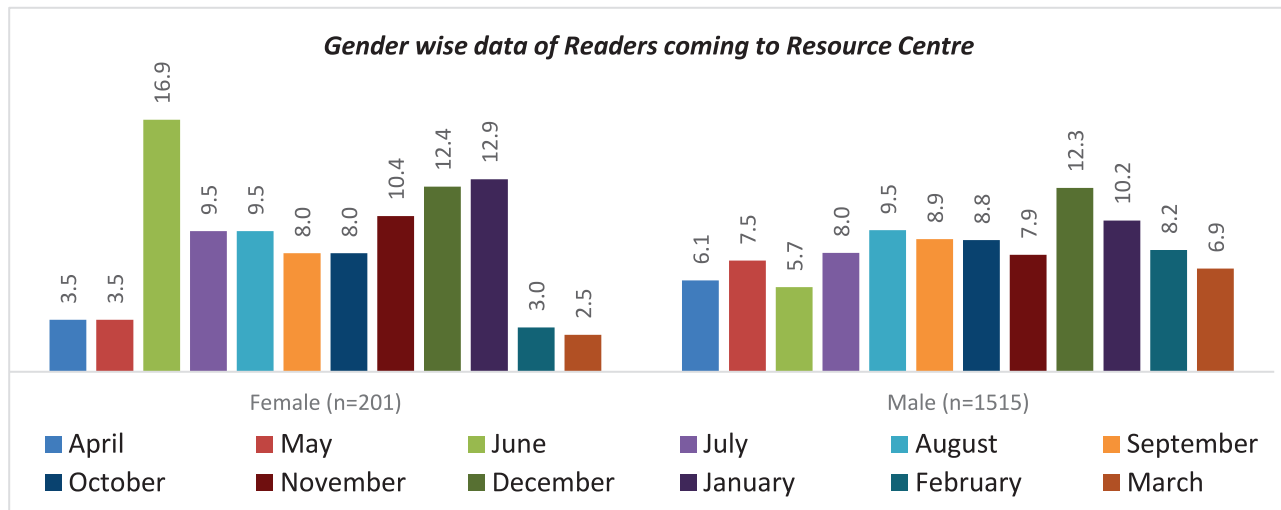

Since UVNAC is the first ever National Center for Adolescents in Delhi, UVCT is going to start skill upgradation activities at UVNAC for Children, Adolescents and Women to help them in becoming self dependent

**Research:** To strengthen our research cell so that we can be more focused on the areas requiring more support. Besides this, we intend to undertake evaluation of our previous programmes.

**Hum Kishore Festival:** Over the years, UVCT has been organizing Hum Kishor Festival in collaboration with a few sponsors. Many competitions in dance, cultural dance, singing, musical instruments, art and craft, rangoli, mehendi etc. were organized in this festival. Many schools in and around Dwarka used to participate with great enthusiasm in them. 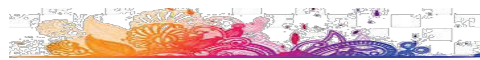

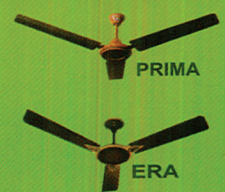

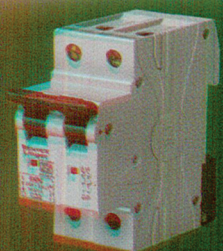
